Prof. Dr. Claudio Nigg is Chair of the Health Sciences Department at the Institute of Sport Science, University of Bern, Switzerland. He received his education in Psychology and Kinesiology at the University of Calgary and Psychology at the University of Rhode Island. Prof. Dr. Nigg specializes in motivation of physical activity and multiple health behavior change in community and population settings.
